## Guidelines for Contributors

**Israel Journal of Plant Sciences** publishes articles dealing with all aspects of plant sciences. Guest editors solicit original research papers, review articles, mini-reviews, and short communications for inclusion in topical special issues. **Since January 2006 the journal no longer accepts unsolicited manuscripts.** All manuscripts are peer-reviewed by experts selected by the Editorial Board. Related published work should be quoted, methods should be adequately described, and the results should be discussed with reference to previous publications. Papers should be written clearly and concisely in English.

### Submission of manuscripts

- Papers should be sent by e-mail to the guest editor. The text should be sent as **both Word and PDF files**. Figures and tables may be included in the Word or PDF documents, **but in any case** should be sent as separate files. **JPEG** and **TIFF** are the preferred formats for figures.
- Receipt of each manuscript will be acknowledged upon its arrival, and an identifying number assigned. Please use this number in all further correspondence.
- Authors should provide the names and e-mail addresses of three possible reviewers in the cover letter accompanying submission.
- The Editors reserve the right to make editorial changes, to return a manuscript for revision, or to reject it. The journal will do whatever possible to keep the material confidential and expedite the publishing process

### Preparation of the manuscript

- A suggested organization of an article is: **Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgments** (if any), and **References**.
- Regular articles should not normally exceed 10–12 printed pages, not including tables and figures (a full page of text contains 500–600 words).
- For general presentation, headings, and legends to figures and tables, please follow the style used in current issues of the Journal.

**Manuscripts** should be double-spaced, with side margins not less than 3 cm wide.

**All authors' first and last names** and affiliations should be given in full, including postal code. Additionally, please provide the **e-mail address, telephone, and fax of the corresponding author**.

An **abstract** not exceeding 200 words is required at the beginning of the paper.

Authors should suggest **3–6 key words** as well as a **running title** (not exceeding 35 letters and spaces).

The **introduction** should be clear and concise, and should refer to important previous work relevant to the subject.

The **complete scientific name** (genus, species, and authority) should be cited for each plant at its first mention. Spelling of plant names should follow "Index Kewensis".

**References in the text** should be cited by the author's name and year of publication, e.g., (Levy and Parker, 1980)" or "as stated by Levy and Parker (1980)." Use the format "Levy et al., 1980" for three or more authors.

**The list of references** should be arranged alphabetically, by author, at the end of the text. Names of all authors should be given. Authors should check the accuracy and relevance of the references with special care. Titles of articles cited should be given in full; titles of periodicals may be given in full or abbreviated. Titles of books should be given in full, including the name of the publisher and the place of publication. Edited books should quote the name(s) of the editor(s).

**Figure captions** should be listed together on a separate sheet. The scales should be indicated on the figure itself. Reduction or magnification should not be indicated in the caption, as this does not take into account printing reduction.

**Lettering** in figures should be large enough (10–12 point) to be legible when reduced to final size.

### Color illustrations may be accepted at no cost.

Corresponding authors will have one month's free access and download privileges to the issue which includes their article.
